**Subject:** **Adopt Fire District Benefit Assessment Resolution No. 2021-04, reaffirming the District's Intent to continue to levy the Fire Suppression Assessment of 1987 and Supplemental Fire Suppression Assessment of 1998.**

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**BACKGROUND:**

- The Fire District currently has two Fire Suppression Assessments: the first was established in 1987 (Fire Suppression Assessment) for \$52.00 per risk unit, and the second in 1998 (Supplemental Fire Suppression Assessments) for \$59.00 per risk unit.
- In order for assessments to continue, each year, the Rodeo–Hercules Fire Protection District Board of Directors is required to adopt a resolution to continue to levy the Fire Suppression Assessment, and the Supplemental Fire Suppression Assessment on all real property in the Fire District.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

If the board chooses not to adopt resolution 2021-04, Fire Suppression Assessment, and declining reaffirmation of the 1987 and 1998 benefit assessments. The Fire District would realize a budget shortfall of \$1,361,249 to its general fund revenues.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

It is staff's recommendation that that the Board reaffirms levying and collection of the Fire District Benefit Assessments, by the adoption of Resolution 2021-04.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2021-04**

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING INTENTION TO CONTINUE TO LEVY  
FIRE SUPPRESSION ASSESSMENTS AND SUPPLEMENTAL FIRE  
SUPPRESSION ASSESSMENT ON ALL PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY  
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022,  
FOR THE RODEO - HERCULES FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, The Rodeo Fire Protection District expanded to cover the City of Hercules in 1983 and formed the Rodeo Hercules Fire Protection District (the "Fire District"); and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Fire District is to provide fire protection and emergency response services throughout its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Rodeo - Hercules Fire Protection District is authorized, pursuant to the authority provided in California Government Code Section 50078 et seq. Article 3 of the California Constitution, to levy assessments within the meaning of Proposition 218; and

WHEREAS, assessments for fire protection and emergency services has been given the distinctive designations of the "Fire Suppression Assessment" and "Supplemental Fire Suppression Assessment" ("Assessment"), and is primarily described as encompassing the Fire District jurisdictional boundaries on all parcels of real property; and

WHEREAS, the Assessment was authorized by assessment ballot proceedings conducted in 1987 and then again in 1998, and approved by ballots returned by property owners, and such assessments were levied subsequently in each fiscal year by the Board of Directors of the Rodeo Hercules Fire Protection District; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Suppression assessment fees are not determined according to, nor in any manner based upon, the assessed value of property; this fee is based upon the improvements to said type of parcels and, the risk of fire attendant to such improvements and parcels; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE RODEO HERCULES FIRE DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

**Description of the Services.** Within the Assessment District, the proposed services and equipment to be funded by the assessments ("Services") are generally described as including, but not limited to, obtaining, furnishing, operating, and maintaining fire suppression, protection and emergency services equipment and apparatus; paying salaries, benefits and other compensation for firefighting and fire prevention personnel; training and administration of personnel performing said fire suppression, protection and emergency services; community

fire prevention education and fire inspection.

**Parcel.** The land and any improvements thereon, designated by an assessor's parcel map and parcel number and carried on the secured property tax roll of the Contra Costa County.

**Description of Assessment District.** The Assessment District consists of the lots and parcels shown within the boundary map of the Assessment District on file with the Secretary of the Board, and reference is hereby made to such map for further particulars.

**Assessment Rate.** It is the intention of this Board to levy and collect assessments within the Assessment District for both the Fire Suppression Assessment and Supplemental Fire Suppression Assessment in the amount of \$1111.00 per one risk factor. The maximum assessment is determined by multiplying the fee rates times the risk units for a particular use.

**Collection.** The assessment on each parcel may be directly billed to the property owner or will be billed on the secured roll tax bills for ad valorem property taxes and

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**CCCERA**

**Contra Costa County Employees Retirement Association-** The California Supreme Court issued a unanimous decision upholding the constitutionality of the legislative changes contained in Assembly Bill 197 to the definition of "compensation earnable." The Supreme Court decision was issued in the case *Alameda County Deputy Sheriff's Assoc. et al., v. Alameda County Employees' Retirement Assn., et al.*, and is referred to as the *Alameda* decision. The decision resolved legal challenges which sought to prevent CCCERA and two other county retirement systems from implementing the AB 197 amendments to the County Employees Retirement Law of 1937 ("CERL"), Govt. Code §31450 *et seq.*

CCCERA's Policy on Determining "Compensation Earnable" Under Assembly Bill 197 For Purposes of Calculating Retirement Benefits For "Legacy" (Pre-PEPRA) Members ("Compensation Earnable" Policy) was adopted in September of 2014 to comply with a Judgment and Writ issued in 2014 by the Contra Costa County Superior Court. The 2014 Judgment and Writ changed the way CCCERA was obligated to calculate Legacy Members' retirement allowances, primarily by requiring CCCERA to exclude certain elements of compensation that previously were treated as "compensation earnable" if earned or received during the final average salary ("FAS") period.

Under the *Alameda* decision, the 2014 Judgment and Writ will no longer apply, and CCCERA will be required to implement AB 197 in full. CCCERA will be required to reverse any aspects of the 2014 Judgment and Writ that may be inconsistent with AB 197.

What effects will this have on RHFPD employees? The Fire District currently has ten members that are classified as "Legacy" members in CCCERA. Because the Fire District currently does not use non-allowable compensations in employee pay, there will be no effect on the District's Legacy employees.

**Labor Relations – Personnel –**

All COVID-19 safety precautions continue to remain in place. Crew safety and protection remain our most significant concerns. Crews are strictly following CDC, County Health, and the Medical Director's guidelines on personal protective equipment, EMS responses, and decontamination. Personnel currently monitor their health before, when arriving, and during their duty shift. Personal protective equipment supplies and burn rates are monitored and tracked by the department's medical program manager. The District is currently following recommended CDC guidelines in response to employee illness and or exposure to COVID-19.

The Fire District currently has two personnel on worker's compensation leave.

The District has now entered contract negotiations with the represented employees' labor group. The current Memorandum of Understanding expires on June 30, 2021. **Reporting:** Chief Craig

### **Fire Stations/Training Facility–**

Multi-company training has resumed with CDC guidelines in place.

Probationary employees are continuing their training and Task Book signoffs.

**Reporting:** Chief Craig

**Facilities** – Painting of the interior of Station 75 has been completed and will now be followed by Station 76. The construction of the retaining at Station 76 has now been completed. The Sea-Land containers located at Station 76 and are used for storage of surplus equipment are in the process of being cleaned out. Some of the equipment will be retained, but the majority will be donated or scrapped. Painting of the interiors of the stations is the second phase of a multistage remodeling project taking place at both stations. This project began in 2019 with the painting of the exterior of both Fire Stations. Other phases of the project will be focused on changing the environment of the interior surfaces with a focus on ease of decontamination.

**Reporting:** Chief Craig

**Grants/Reimbursements** – The Fire District, along with other agencies, have received guidance and authorization from FEMA to begin the process for submitting federal reimbursements for personnel cost associated with the vaccination clinics. Contra Costa Counties CAO office is the collection point for all agencies seeking reimbursements from FEMA. The Fire District is required to submit detailed documented payroll information to the CAO's office once a month to be eligible for reimbursements.

**Reporting:** Chief Craig

**Incident Activity** – Emergency response frequency is remaining high, with the type, magnitude, and impact of those responses, putting a strain on our resources. The number and severity of opioid overdose responses are still increasing. The Fire District Medical program manager has requested to increase the amount of "Narcan" carried on the first out apparatus. This request has been granted. See the attached fire response report for April.

**Community Risk Reduction** – Company conducted business inspections are currently on hold, with a plan to resume in June in combination with the reopening of the State. The District's website and new Facebook page will continue to be updated with relevant information about the Fire District and current events. A new tab has been added to the website for the public to access information related to the annexation study.

**Community /Wildfire Prevention** – New guidance has been issued to all residents within the District regarding wildfire prevention and property mitigation. Staff is scheduled to meet with CalFire for an update on the Fire Districts State Response Areas and Mutual threat zones.

**Fleet Management** – The Pierce Type 1 has arrived in Sacramento for its 300-point inspection before starting fabrication for mounting of equipment. The Smeal 100' Ladder Truck will be ready for final inspection in Nebraska on May 24.

**Fiscal Stabilization** – Staff continues to monitor the current Fiscal Year budget. District staff has scheduled meetings with the Board's Budget Ad-Hoc committee and is in the development process of the fiscal year 21/22 budget.

**Fire District Annexation Study** – Fire District Staff has completed and supplied the required information and data for AP Triton that provide them with in-depth data related to all Fire District, functions, personnel, facilities, fleet, and finances. This information is needed to complete a thorough analysis of the Fire District as it relates to annexation. All three district fire chiefs involved in the annexation meet weekly to discuss the next steps and provide updates.

**Community Activities –Attended** Phillips 66 Community Advisory Panel, Rodeo Municipal Advisory Panel, and Hercules Rotary meetings by Zoom. Each organization was provided an update in regards to consolidation.
